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2. PŘEHLED PROVÁDĚNÍ

2.1. Informace o provádění programu na základě společných ukazatelů pro částečně nebo zcela dokončené operace.

Information on the implementation of the programme in relation to common indicators following carried out partial or complete operations

During 2017, the standard implementation of all the particular objectives of the OP FMA continued.

SO I:

Under the call No. 30_16_003, the implementation of projects aimed at providing lunches for children in need in school and preschool facilities took place within the first half of 2017. These were the 4 regions involved:

- The Capital City of Prague: budget CZK 3 986 012,00 (EUR 154 287,28[1]), 67 school facilities, expected number of supported children: 714; real number of supported children: 282, finally approved CZK 1 183 144,73 (EUR 45 796,20).
- The South Moravian Region: budget CZK 4 839 227,00 (EUR 187 312,83), 48 school facilities, expected number of supported children: 866; real number of supported children: 1033, finally approved CZK 3 192 619,50 (EUR 123 577,30).
- The Vysočina Region: budget CZK 4 404 092,00 (EUR 170 469,98), 40 school facilities, expected number of supported children: 768; real number of supported children: 324, finally approved CZK 1 354 536,75 (EUR 52 430,30).
- Liberec Region: budget CZK 4 813 216,00 (EUR 186 306,02), 40 school facilities, expected number of supported children: 966; real number of supported children: 455, finally approved CZK 1 804 177,20 (EUR 69 832,29).

All the projects were duly completed in 08/2017 (on-site inspections and billing took place in the first quarter of 2018).

In 2017, one Call was released within SO I:

- 9 regions applied in the Call: Liberec, South Moravian, Vysočina, the Capital City of Prague, Hradec Králové, Plzeň, Moravian-Silesian, Karlovy Vary and (in fall) Zlín.

- Allocation of the Call: CZK 30 million CZK (EUR million 1,16), increased to CZK 55 million (EUR million 2,13)
- Applications received till 31/05/2018 and 31/10/2018 (projects for the second half of the year).

- The Hradec Králové Region: budget CZK 4 999 547,70 (EUR 193 518,39), 69 school facilities, expected number of supported children: 878; approved children: 411.
- The Moravian-Silesian Region: budget CZK 17 340 785,70 (EUR 671 212,92), 101 school facilities, expected number of supported children: 3011; approved children: 2380.
- The Zlín region: budget CZK 361 098,15 (EUR 13 977,09), 16 school facilities, expected number of supported children: 136; approved children: 62.

The implementation of the projects will take place till 08/2019 and detailed data of the implementation will be available in the next annual report.

SO II and III

Throughout 2017, the implementation of the project Food and Material Aid for the most Deprived continued (the project was described in detail in the previous annual report).

The project budget was increased (June 2017) from approximately CZK 103 million (EUR million 3,99) to the final CZK 238 million (EUR million 9,21). This step was discussed with both the EC and the OP FMA WG and is part of the SO II and III long-term management where it is considered effective to gradually extend the schedule and increase the budget of the OP FMA project in relation to identified needs and capacities of the entities that distribute the aid to final beneficiaries (instead of announcing new calls and preparing new projects).

The range of goods has been greatly expanded. New items have been added to the list of food and hygiene supplies (already distributed in 2016), selected textiles and household supplies have also been added. **The List of Commodities is shown in Annex of the Report.**

During November and December, a **questionnaire survey** was carried out among SO II and III final beneficiaries, on the basis of which a report **the Evaluation of the Questionnaire Survey of the Assistance Beneficiaries**, containing valuable information on the SO II and III target group was drawn up. The report can be found in **Annex**.

Food packages contents

In the first four months of 2017, the implementation of the FMA I project continued. Two types of food packages were distributed (food packages A for families or people with the possibility of their own cooking contained both cooking ingredients and food for direct consumption, food packages B primarily for people without the possibility of their own cooking contained food for direct consumption) – for the contents of food packages see the Annex - 1st Project.

During the whole year 2017, the FMA II project was also implemented. Packages with fixed contents were not supplied to partner organizations any longer but partner organizations could choose just the food they needed the most for their clients from a list of commodities. In connection with this, the range of assistance has been extended by other food items (for the list of supplied food products see the Annex - 2nd project).

This has also made it easier to combine the FEAD assistance with the assistance that partner organizations receive from other sources and prevent food wastage by providing clients with exactly the food that suits their individual needs.

Therefore, organizations could themselves select which commodities and in what quantity and proportion they are interested in. Consequently, they put together a set according to specific needs or preferences of a particular client from these commodities. So by "a package" we mean a set of goods that is given to a client during one of their visit as a single benefit portion.

Methodology of calculating indicators by estimation (reference weeks)

Indicators are calculated based on the data provided by partner organizations. The numbers of individuals uniquely supported by the food and material assistance are continuously monitored and recorded by partner organizations and reported at the end of each monitoring period, i.e. the end of the year.

The representation of individual specific groups among the supported persons is dealt with by reporting within so-called reference weeks. During the implementation of projects, the reference weeks (usually two weeks) take place twice a year. At that time, organizations watch closely the ratio of target group types that use their help. Due to a fairly stable composition of the target groups of particular organizations, these data provide sufficient corresponding value and the acquired numbers can be projected over the entire duration of the project (or any reference period).

The acquired ratio of specific groups from the reference weeks is then multiplied by the number of uniquely supported persons in the reference period, thus obtaining the total number of supported persons in given specific groups during a particular reference period

Specific impacts of the ESF – FEAD cooperation

The organizations involved in FEAD projects usually use the possibilities of ESF as well to provide an interconnected care in a few steps. However, this is a free, not an official interconnection, and particular cases are not monitored.

Number of handicapped people - the reason of the increase

During 2017, the launch of the FMA II project significantly changed (expanded) the structure of the involved partner organizations. Among new partner organizations were mainly food banks that subsequently cooperated with other non-profit organizations. In this way, other organizations working mainly or exclusively with handicapped persons were involved.

Prices of food per person – the reason of the increase

The reason of the increase in price can be seen in two aspects.

The first one is a certain delay in payments for food supplies at the end of the year as the payment is finally carried out already at the beginning of the following year. For this reason, the price for the food delivered in 2016 could be perceived as slightly lower than it actually was.

The second aspect is the launch of the FMA II project and the extension of the range of food assistance by other types of food. A very significant expenditure item from these new types of food is mainly milk infant food, which thus increases the average food price per person.

Information on the implementation of accompanying measures

Accompanying measures were provided along with the distribution of the food or material assistance. The most common types of accompanying measures included social counseling, both direct and indirect (the mediation of the service to a client).

Other important accompanying measures were providing further information on the possibilities of

assistance, nutrition counselling, financial counseling and counseling in difficult life situations. Accompanying measures were offered to each client but the actual use of them always depended on the client's free will.

Based on the experience of partner organizations, clients can be more willing to cooperate and accept the accompanying measures when they are offered together with the food and material assistance, although sometimes this happens only after certain time of building trust. Results of accompanying measures show differences between different groups of socially disadvantaged people.

According to the assessment of partner organizations, the effectiveness of accompanying measures is lower for homeless people, but on the contrary, it is more efficient as far as incomplete families or socially disadvantaged elderly people are concerned, e.g. by using counseling to solve a specific situation, or establishing cooperation with a particular social service.

2.2. Informace o činnostech, které zohledňují zásady uvedené v čl. 5 odst. 6, čl. 5 odst. 11 a, je-li to vhodné, čl. 5 odst. 13 nařízení (EU) č. 223/2014, a jejich posouzení.

Article 5, point 6 of Regulation 223/2014 on the FEAD

Coordination with ESF-funded programmes takes place at an inter-ministerial level, by participation of the members of MA OPE and the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports in the OP FMA Working Group, as well as at the working level in setting methodologies for partners.

In the case of financing of school meals, there are no similar measures in the Czech programmes co-financed by the ESF. However, different sources are used by NGOs that carry out similar measures focused on different parts of target groups. Even in 2017, the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports implemented similar measures financed from the state budget. All the measures are mutually complementary. Measures of the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports extend the target group by persons who do not belong to the target group of the OP FMA, while at the same time they do not cover nursery schools.

Article 5, Clause 11 of Regulation 223/2014 on the FEAD

When implementing all the OP FMA projects, equal approach to men and women is strictly observed. Assistance is provided by partner organisations to all those who are in need and it is based on equal approach, i.e. women and men are treated equally, regardless of gender, whenever a situation requiring assistance has been identified with the individual. For each assistance beneficiary, therefore, it was assessed whether the person belonged into the target group.

The preparation of projects, especially at the level of selection of the types of the assistance provided, took into account the needs of the target groups. Similarly, the distribution of assistance and accompanying measures (in the case of SO II and SO III) are carried out under conditions that respect the capabilities and needs of the target groups.

When preparing the projects, it was found out that e.g. single parents or parents with children in shelters or those using other types of social services belong among the most endangered target groups of the OP FMA, an important part of the assistance was therefore targeted on such help to children, which usually represents a significant item in the budget of families with small children or of single parents. As part of the preparation of the public procurement for material assistance, a special hygienic package designed to cover the needs of small children was also defined, including hygienic items for small children and also nappies in 5 different sizes. Based on the demand of the target group, SO II and SO III identified and included in the range of goods provided also other types of hygienic needs, which are used specifically by women (e.g., women's sanitary napkins, underwear).

Article 5, Clause 13 of Regulation 223/2014 on the FEAD

Food selection takes into account demands for a balanced diet, the environmental principle and also prevention of food waste.

In the case of SO I, the selection of ingredients, diet composition and monitoring of distributed portions are regulated by the national legislation and the updated market basket (Decree No. 107/2005 Coll., on School Meals, included in the annexes). Requirements for the preparation, composition and fulfilment of hygiene standards are monitored by the National Audit Authority – the Czech School Inspectorate.

While preparing SO II, a great emphasis was placed on a balanced diet, and especially its quality, within the scope of the chosen distribution method. Individual types of commodities were continuously consulted with organisations that work directly with target groups and are therefore aware of their needs and the most frequent eating deficiencies when preparing a public procurement contract.

The required composition of products was defined so as to achieve a high level of food quality with regard to the content of the key ingredients of the food.

This includes, for example, high meat content, low content of added substances, low fat content, high proportions of the fruit component, etc. For each food, the minimum required residual shelf life at the time of delivery was also defined to guarantee usability of the food for a given period of time.

The distribution of a high variety of food assistance contributes to a greater balanced diet (while at the end of 2015, there was a total of 12 different types of offered food, the number gradually increased to 41 different types of food in 2016. The food was distributed with minor alterations, e.g. packaged soups, even in 2017. As part of the composition of food assistance, both needs of those who have the option to cook at home and those who do not have this option were taken into account. Therefore the food assistance includes ingredients for cooking as well as food for direct consumption.

The environmental burden reduction requirement was also taken into account when defining relevant types of commodities in public procurements, such as toilet paper or paper tissues (made from recycled paper).

Settlement of the MA: Monitoring the overlap between the SO I and SO II(III) target group has not been set up yet and the data cannot be retrieved. MO perceives the comment as an important impulse and possibilities of acquiring such kind of data will be further explored.
